

1. Intended Use

The crutches are for persons with limited walking ability and serve to increase ability to walk. They are suitable for use inside, and outside on street surfaces. Always observe the rules for proper use. For questions, consult your specialised dealer.



2. Proper Use

Before using the crutches for the first time, have your specialised dealer or careprovider instruct you on proper use and use with regards to your specific walking ability limitations! To assure your safety, carefully read the instructions and advisories in this pamphlet!



3. Adjusting the Crutch

DANGER!

Incorrectly adjusted crutches can limit the functional capability of the crutch or lead to excessive physical exertion by the patient!

The crutch will be given to you in a complete and proper condition, and adjusted to exactly suit your body size. If you have any doubts concerning the adjustment of your crutches, then consult with your specialised dealer!



4. Defects with the Crutches

If something has become loose, misaligned or damaged on the crutch, then consult with your specialised dealer or care provider!



5. Rental

The crutches are adjusted to suit your exact needs. Do not lend the crutches to another person.



Regular maintenance and care of your crutches assure proper function. For your safety, have your crutches inspected by a specialised dealer at least once a year.



7. Spare Parts, Accessories and Repair

Genuine spare parts and accessories are available for the entire REBOTEC range of crutches. Please contact your specialised dealer for parts and repairs.





> All screwed connections must be tight. > The crutch tip must not be worn out.




> By excessive wear or visible damage,

You must place the crutch as vertically as possible (Fig. D "correct") on the surface! Do not place the end of the crutch too far away from your body (Fig. D "false").











Allow the crutch to fall to the side if possible so that you yourself do not fall on the crutch!



• Do not place your crutches for an extended period of time in the sunlight or heat (e.g. near a heater or behind a car window).

- · Never hang bags, purses or other objects (Fig. G) on your crutches!
- Never attempt any kind of mechanical alterations to your crutches, as we are not then able to assure any safety for the crutches because of product liability reasons.
- For the same reasons, only original spare parts and accessories may be used.

- The crutches must never be used for other purposes (Fig. H), for example not for lifting, prying or moving of furniture or other objects. Do not use the crutches to help you to stand up!
- If unused for an extended time period, have the crutch inspected by a specialist before using again.



. Use on Snow and Ice

Do not use on ice or snow if the crutches are not equipped with wintertime accessories, (ice claws).



9. Proper Disposal

A defective or a used crutch does not belong in the household rubbish. Contact your waste disposal services for enquiring of its proper disposal.



10. Care

If the crutches are dirty, you can clean them with a mild detergent and a soft cloth. Clean all plastic parts with a mild commercially available plastic cleanser.

In most cases simply using a moist cloth and wiping dry is enough for cleaning. Always follow the manufacturer's instructions on the cleanser container.



DANGER!

Never clean the handle or crutch tip with oily substances. There's an increased risk of slipping and falling!


